ABOUT T. THOMAS FORTUNE

Timothy Thomas Fortune was a nationally known critic of the rise of Jim Crow and the failure of reconstruction in the wake of the Civil War. Fortune edited and published three Afro American (a term he popularized) newspapers with a national circulation during his career.

T. Thomas Fortune was virtually unparalleled in his time for his agitation, education, and organization over a span of roughly 50 years (1880-1928). He used his newspaper to organize the first convention of the Afro-American League, considered to be a precursor to the NAACP. At his passing, he was eulogized as the Dean of Black Journalism and his work remains highly relevant today.
